Growing Generations in Christ
Why Our Core Values Matter

At Carmi Emmanuel, we say that our mission is to grow generations in Christ. That isn’t just a slogan—it’s our calling from God. But if you’ve ever tried to grow anything—a garden, a family, even a friendship—you know that growth doesn’t happen by accident. Growth requires strong roots. It’s our Core Values that provide those roots. Let me take a moment to share how these seven Core Values support and shape our mission:

1. We will stand unwaveringly for Scriptural Holiness

If we’re going to grow generations in Christ, it must start with hearts that are fully His. We want to be a people who reflect Christ’s purity, His love, and His truth in every part of our lives. Holiness is the soil where spiritual growth begins. 2. We will be committed to Social Holiness

John Wesley reminded us that there is no holiness apart from social holiness. We live out our faith in community. When we care for the poor, defend the vulnerable, and seek justice, we model to the next generation what it means to follow Jesus in the real world. Our witness grows stronger when our love is visible.

3. We will be enthusiastic about Passionate Evangelism

Growing generations in Christ means we’re always reaching. We don’t want our faith to stop with us. Passionate evangelism means we care enough to share the Good News—at home, at work, and wherever God sends us. Each generation hears the Gospel because the previous one was faithful to proclaim it.

4. We will commit ourselves to Faithful Stewardship

Growth requires resources, and those resources come from the faithful generosity of God’s people. When we give of our time, talents, and treasures, we invest in the future of the church. Stewardship ensures that the ministries that shape lives today will still be thriving tomorrow.

5. We will be known for Radical Hospitality

Generations won’t grow in Christ if they don’t feel welcomed at His table. Radical hospitality opens doors, hearts, and lives to people of every background and circumstance. In a divided world, we want to be known as the people who made room for others—just like Jesus did.

6. We will embrace the power of Dynamic Discipleship

Evangelism plants the seed, but discipleship nurtures it to maturity. Through Bible study, small groups, mentoring, and accountability, we help people grow deep roots in their faith. Dynamic discipleship means we are never finished growing—we’re always being transformed to look more like Christ, or as Wesley said, “going on to perfection”.

7. We will embrace the power of Thriving Worship

Finally, worship is the heartbeat of our church. When we gather with joy, humility, and expectation, God meets us. Thriving worship centers us on Christ, fills us with His Spirit, and sends us back into the world renewed. Worship reminds every generation that Jesus is Lord. These Core Values aren’t just statements on paper. They’re commitments we make together, as a church family, so that Christ is formed in us and through us—in this generation and the ones to come.

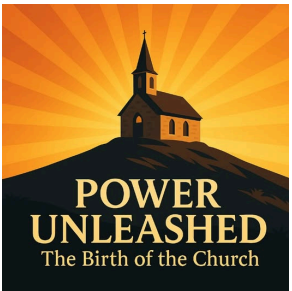
