Passionate Evangelism and Radical Hospitality
Open Hearts, Open Doors, Good News to Share

January often feels like a fresh start. New calendars, new rhythms, and new opportunities lie ahead. Spiritually, it’s also a season to ask an important question: Who is God calling us to reach in this new year? Two of our Core Values speak directly to that question—Passionate Evangelism and Radical Hospitality.

We are enthusiastic about Passionate Evangelism because the Gospel is good news meant to be shared. Jesus’ final words to His disciples were not a suggestion but a commission: “Go and make disciples of all nations” (Matthew 28:19, NIV). Evangelism doesn’t always look like a sermon or a street-corner conversation. More often, it begins with prayer, intentional relationships, and a willingness to speak the name of Jesus with clarity and love when the moment comes.

But evangelism rarely stands alone. It is strengthened by Radical Hospitality. People are far more open to hearing the Good News when they first experience genuine welcome. Hospitality says, You belong here. It opens doors, lowers defenses, and creates space for the Spirit to work. From a warm greeting to an open seat, from an invitation to a meal, to an invitation to worship, hospitality prepares the soil of the heart.

These values are especially important as we begin a new ministry year together. Early in January, we will gather for our 2026 Leadership Summit, an annual moment where those serving in leadership come together for prayer, vision, and unity of purpose. Scripture reminds us, “Where there is no guidance, a people falls, but in an abundance of counselors there is safety” - Proverbs 11:14. The Leadership Summit is not just about organization or calendars—it is about aligning our hearts under the headship of Christ, being anointed for the work God has entrusted to us, and committing ourselves to serve well so that others may encounter Christ through our faithfulness. Strong leadership, grounded in prayer and humility, creates space for evangelism and hospitality to flourish throughout the church.

As we step into this new year, may we be a church that opens both our mouths and our lives —sharing the truth of Christ and making room for others to encounter Him among His people. In doing so, we continue the work God has given us: Growing Generations in Christ.
